The Children's Gardening Festival at Brigg Garden Centre will feature a range of interactive activities designed to spark the curiosity and creativity of young minds. Participants can look forward to activities such as sowing seeds for bees, crafting bug hotels, and experiencing music generated by actual plants.

In addition to hands-on gardening activities, families can enjoy reading sessions in the gardening library and embark on a gardening hunt around the garden centre. The festival is designed to be inclusive, ensuring a delightful experience for visitors of all ages and provides a unique opportunity for families to connect through a blend of education, creativity, and fun.

The Skinny Jean Gardener Children's Mini Festival will take place at Brigg Garden Centre on Saturday 10th, and

Sunday 11th February, between 10 am and 3 pm. Tickets cost £10 per child for the event which also includes access to Brigg Garden Centre's soft play and a go on the store's train ride.
